# PROJECT UPDATE

On behalf of the Bassendean Activity Centre project partners we have some news to share with you.

Following the recent Town of Bassendean Council resolution regarding the Bassendean Activity Centre project, the Town will continue to work with the community, LandCorp, Swan Districts Football Club and other stakeholders to progress the project.

In response to community feedback the Town wishes to update its broader Town Centre strategic planning framework prior to the State Government committing further resources and investment into the revitalisation of the Town Centre.

This means that redevelopment of the Wilson Street and Bassendean Oval sites (as per the Council's resolution) are to be considered in parallel with any updates the Town may make to its local planning framework for the Town Centre.

This is an opportunity for the Town, through the guidance of their recently appointed Director of Strategic Planning, to update their planning framework in line with new State Government policies such as *Perth and Peel@3.5million* and to conduct further community engagement activities to gather input from local residents and businesses.

The Town will now independently investigate revitalisation opportunities for the Civic Centre.

The BIC Reserve is no longer being considered for any development proposal.

We encourage you to look out for announcements from the Town as to how you can continue to be involved in the future planning of Bassendean.

## Do you know what Household Hazardous Waste is?

**Household Hazardous Waste is the unwanted products used in and around the home that are flammable, toxic, reactive or corrosive. If Household Hazardous Waste is not disposed of correctly it will harm our environment and may in turn harm aquatic life, animals and humans.**

**So please do the right thing and dispose of these products safely.**

Household Hazardous Waste should not be placed in your refuse (green-top) bin or recycling (yellow top) bins, otherwise this waste will most likely end up as landfill and contaminate our environment.

**Town of Bassendean residents can take Household Hazardous Waste products (up to 20 L or 20 kg) with no charge to the Red Hill Waste Management Facility, 1094 Toodyay Road, Red Hill.**

Household Hazardous Waste items (combined total of 20 kg/20 L max) accepted at Red Hill Waste Management Facility:

- Automotive fluids (coolant, brake fluid).
- Poisons.
- Flammable liquids.
- Pool and garden chemicals.
- Fluorescent lights.
- Gas cylinders.
- Batteries (household and car).
- Paint/solvents.
- Motor oil.
- Asbestos (can take to Red Hill Waste Management Facility—fee payable).

### Around your home

Hazardous Household Waste is usually found in the following places around your home:

**IN THE BATHROOM**—cleaners (window, shower, tile), disinfectants, hair colours and bleaches, medicines and prescription drugs, pharmaceuticals, nail polish and nail polish remover.

**IN THE KITCHEN**—drain cleaners, window cleaners, bleaches, disinfectants, oven cleaners, metal (e.g. silver) polishes, furniture polishes, fire extinguishers, floor care products.

**IN THE GARDEN**—pesticides, fertilisers, fungicide, weed killers, mouse and rat poisons, lawn chemicals, herbicides, insect repellents, insecticides.


**IN THE GARAGE OR WORKSHOP**—contact cements, thinners, lacquers, paint/stain strippers and removers, stains, varnishes, roof tar and other water proofing agents, oil-based paints, chemical strippers, photographic chemicals, car waxes, starting fluids, repair products, auto batteries and battery fluid, transmission fluids, rust removers, brake fluid, wood preservative, glue, degreaser, petrol, motor oils, kerosene, lighter fluid, dye, gas cylinders (from BBQs, camping stoves and lamps), pool chemicals, insect repellents and insecticides.

**AROUND THE HOME**—Flea collars and sprays, cockroach/ flea/fly bombs, pet worming tablets, heartworm tablets, mothballs, fluorescent tubes and bulbs, aerosol cans, batteries and chargers.

The aim of the Program is to enable eligible organisations to facilitate and stage events that will contribute to the overall quality of life of residents and to provide an approach for facilitating community development within the Town of Bassendean.

# Verge transformations



Properties within the Town of Bassendean are undergoing a 'Garden Blitz' with groups of enthusiastic volunteers working together to transform verges into more sustainable, productive, practical and social spaces.

The 'Verge Transformation Project' has come about as the result of the Act Local Be Global in Bassendean initiative that the Town has been running since July. Ashfield resident Emma Slavin of Urban Botanics has been the Local Project Coordinator.

As part of that initiative the community had a number of opportunities to participate in workshops to develop local strategies around the idea of 'Acting Local while Thinking Global' to create a more just and sustainable world.

A number of great ideas were developed and the Verge Transformation project was the one selected by the community to proceed with. Since then over 40 people and organisations within the Town have registered to transform their verge.



Seven 'Demonstration Verges' have been transformed by groups of self-help volunteers to provide others with ideas and inspiration. These verges are spread across the Town.

"These have also been great opportunities for participants to create new connections and learn about sustainable gardening," said Emma Slavin.

To sustain the project, Emma has produced a 'DIY Verge Transformation Kit' and the 'Verge Working Bee Network' was launched as part of a Celebration Event held on the 26 November.

"Our verges are a public asset for everyone to enjoy. Water-wise verge gardens save water, provide habitat for local wildlife, beautify our local streets and provide greater opportunities for social interaction among neighbours. Together we can make a difference," stated Mayor Gangell.

## What are the benefits of shrubs and trees?

The major benefits of shrubs and trees in urban areas are that they reduce air pollution, mitigate excessive noise from the surrounding area, provide habitat for wildlife and support biodiversity, reduce ultraviolet (UV) radiation exposure, cool the air through evapotranspiration and, as a result, reduce energy demand, which in turn lowers carbon emissions.

Trees also enhance a sense of place and identity, improve mental wellbeing by encouragement of outdoor activity, and last but not least, trees increase property values.

So, if you have a place in your garden where some shrubs or trees can be planted, please discuss with your local nursery as they can recommend the perfect plant for the available space.

In small gardens, consider using small trees as feature plantings, or towards corners where a garden feature such as an urn or seating can be placed underneath.

Remember to select a shrub or tree that grows to a height and width suited to the available space—always read the label. There are many opportunities to bring beauty and a sense of serenity and peacefulness to any sized garden.
